2. Receive Update From Cambridge Systematics

Strategic Programs and Feasibility Analysis. Chiranjivi (Chiru) provided an update. There was a comment deadline of August 12. They are looking for additional comments in order to finalize this memo. The comment period will be extended to hard deadline of August 31, and after that date, comments and edits will be hard to do. Joanne McDermott indicated she would be providing comments.

Demonstration Project. Chiru indicated a planned demonstration for December. Jolene Hayes will provide an update on this item in the near future. Michael Sigala asked for a conceptual understanding of the demonstration project (something in writing).

Stakeholder Outreach. Michael Fischer indicated a planned joint Stakeholder meeting (both goods movement studies) for late September or early October. Topics to be discussed would include an intro to both projects, information collected to date, solicit feedback from group, presentation of work to date (connectors, rural corridors, truck parking), presentation of I-5/SR 99 project findings, then smaller breakout group discussions. A Doodle poll will follow for potential meeting dates. Michael Sigala read the portion of the RFP that dealt with required Stakeholder outreach and asked for meeting date and list of attendees as soon as possible.

Review Project Schedule. Michael Sigala reviewed the project schedule. Demonstration project and Stakeholder outreach are falling behind schedule but the other components of the study are on schedule.

3. Other Items

National Multimodal Freight Network (NMFN). Michael Sigala put this on the agenda for TAC discussion, as a September 6, 2016 deadline was included in the NMFN. The deadline is for the NMFN map. The more important deadline is December 2017 when rural and urban priority corridors will be considered for inclusion in the National Highway Freight Network from the State of CA.
