2. **Receive Update from Cambridge Systematics**

Impact Analysis of Strategic Programs (task four). Michael Sigala noted this technical memo was sent out March 6. Jolene requested comments by March 31 with plans to turn the memo again by mid April.

Demonstration Project. Jolene is working with Pelaton for scheduling, and PATH. She noted a technical report for the demonstration project has been completed. There are some budget constraints and she, Les Beshears and Michael Sigala will discuss this off-line.

Outreach Plan. Jolene noted their understanding that they have completed the outreach components of the Study. Another outreach event is being planned for both studies. A doodle poll has been sent out and it is looking like April 18 for a valleywide webinar. Michael Sigala noted that the consultants need to convene two valleywide stakeholder meetings per the scope of the contract and that one valleywide stakeholder meeting has been convened to date. Michael Sigala noted a lack of many industry groups participating in the planning process for both studies. Michael Fischer noted he would invite these groups to the planned webinar and that they were contacted previously.

Contract Completion Update. Les Beshears noted that Caltrans HQ has inquired about the timeline for project completion. June 30, 2017 is the hard deadline to complete the project, all work completed, reports final and all invoices should be in.
