## 2. RTP/Sustainable Communities Strategies/Air Quality Update and Discussion

R. Niblock

Ryan Niblock reported that Senator Beall introduced SB-1291, meant to address the challenge to adopting the 2021 FTIP. The language does not currently reflect comments provided by CalCOG and Caltrans, however they are strongly working on that. In addition, Caltrans and CalCOG are actively engaged on working with members of the Senate Transportation committee to craft language that supports the 2021 FTIP. Ryan encouraged the COGs to continue the work toward developing the 2021 FTIP. FTIP draft modeling files have been circulated for the first round of SAFE Rule adjustment factors, conformity boiler plate and exempt only TIP. Ryan noted the EPA has not provided guidance on SAFE Rule Part 1 or on the adjustment's factors CARB provided. San Joaquin COG provided Type Five RTP amendment last month and it is currently in public comment period. SAFE Rule Part 2 is expected to be released on April 1. Ryan reported on EMPAC 17and summarized the technical differences between EMPAC 14 and EMPAC 17. Impact 17 is scheduled to go in effect August 2021. There was concern about the 2018 SCS approvals by CARB. Bill Higgins added comments on SB-1291 and further discussion ensued.

## 3. Ecosystem of Shared Mobility Services in the SJV Project Update Update on Valley Go (MioCar in the south Valley)

Caroline Rodier, UC Davis ITS, provided a brief overview of MioCar in the south Valley, and shared a short video with the group. All 24 vehicles are operating as of December 2019. There are currently 200 active members and about 90 pending members. This started as a research project and it is now moving toward a non-profit model. Caroline discussed data from several surveys that were conducted; 1) user surveys, and 2) post reservation surveys. Most notable were the average active member has five or more reservations, members travel an average of 73 miles per reservation, and the average rental duration is roughly 14 hours. Out of the eight hubs, the Visalia hub has the fastest growing membership followed by Bakersfield. The project is expected to enter in a Gap funding contract with ARB to fund the second year of operations and soon after they will be eligible for expansion funding. In addition, UC Davis has been able to provide internal grant funds received from SB1 toward MioCar. Caroline discussed the ARB Clean Mobility Option grant as an additional source of funding for expanding the existing project.

Marco Sanchez advised that they will be engaging with local governments to work together on the 10-year plans. There was a request to continue to have a quarterly meeting to discuss SHOPP projects on the list. Laura Gordon confirmed that they are also in constant communication and meeting with the local governments to work side by

side. The was some concern about support cost being too high and there were discussions on what efforts can be done to reduce the cost.

Unfortunately, Dean Flores was a last minute cancelation and a search for a potential replacement is ongoing. Lunch with the commission and the reception the night before have been confirmed. There was concerns of the unwillingness to travel as the news of the coronavirus expands.
