2. Receive Update from Cambridge Systematics

First and last mile connectors. Michael Fischer noted the webinar last month to clarify issues. Connectors are connectors that are not state facilities. The draft connector list has been edited and maps have been put together. TAC members will get to look at these again. The list was about 100 connectors however it is ideal to get the list down to about 50-60 connectors. A revised connector memo is forthcoming next week. The list will also include an additional list for connectors for which data does not exist.

Derek Winning from TCAG indicated they provided a lot of input but haven't received feedback from the consultant group. A conference call between TCAG and the consultant team would be organized.

Kim Kloeb from SJ COG indicated they have a couple of important projects that don't fit in to existing categories for priority projects. Mr. Fisher indicated they would fit into "critical truck routes" and would be included. They could fit into the STAA route discussion.

Truck Parking and Routing. Fatemeh Ranaiefer noted they have a lot of parking data. Another item is illegal parking locations and issues. There is no data for these locations. She indicated the need to have a broader discussion of this. A draft memo on truck parking and routing will be out by the end of July.

Priority Rural Corridors. Michael Fischer reported that FAST Act freight funding criteria will be incorporated into the forthcoming memo on rural corridors. State of CA identification of priority rural corridors will be limited to a certain number of miles. One issue is identifying which routes are STAA. Caltrans' records are not fully up to date and the consultant team needs more feedback from MPOs for example. Kim Kloeb from SJ COG noted a STAA study in their region that he would forward to the group.

Freight Modeling. Fatemeh Ranaiefer reported a meeting last month with the MIP group to better understand the needs for a truck model. Another workshop will be the last Thursday of June at 1:30pm. A survey link will also be sent to the TAC to receive feedback from the first meeting. Discussion ensued regarding relevancy and need for a valleywide truck model.
