2. Receive Update From Cambridge Systematics

Strategic Programs and Feasibility Analysis. Michael Fischer noted the revised task two and three memo, Strategic Programs and Feasibility Analysis, will be out shortly and that they are working on the task four memo, Impacts Analysis of the Strategic Programs, will be out for review in mid November.

Demonstration Project. Matt Hanson of Caltrans noted that December 13 is confirmed for the Demonstration Project. There will small groups of people (3-4) allowed to ride in each truck, five trucks total. Staging area will be Patterson, close to the I-5. Time is approximately 10am to 3pm, nine round trips. Rob Ball asked about drone camera shots and reasons for not doing the demonstration in the Shafter area. Matt Hanson addressed this question and noted the trucks were originating from northern California. Rob Ball volunteered the drone from the City of Shafter to document the demonstration project with hopes of having some component of the demonstration project reaching the south valley. Kim Kloeb also indicated having access to drone capabilities.
