Impact Analysis of Strategic Programs (task four). Jolene Hayes noted a delay in the modeling analysis preventing this technical memo from being released. Fatemeh Ranaiefer provided additional information pertaining to origin-destination data and how it impacts routing in the model. This was a problem particularly in Kern County regarding State Route 58. Jolene Hayes noted just received new data that would help in this analysis to be incorporated into the technical memo to be delivered in approximately one week.
