2. MPO Activity Related to COVID 19 No reports provided.

3. RTP/Sustainable Communities Strategies/Air Quality Ryan Niblock reported that the CARB RTP/SCS data tables are due today, December 1, 2022. Regarding the 2018 PM2.5 SIP, Trinity Consultants is reaching out to MPOs for TAZ data.

Mr. Niblock reported that the current calendar year contract with Trinity Consultants is set to expire at the end of December. He requested a motion to approve a one-year extension to the contract.

4. Budget, Policy and Legislative Updates State of California

Gus Khouri reviewed the 2023 California Legislative Platform. He highlighted key items including highway funding, SR 99, CAPTI, port infrastructure funding, transit operations funding, diesel locomotive rule making, and REAP II. Ahron Hakimi asked about the impending budget deficit. Mr. Khouri reported that ongoing fiscal analysis in the coming month will reveal more. Samir Sheikh, SJVAPCD, noted the proposed locomotive rule making is complicated by applicability for class one rail and passenger rail. Mr. Sheikh will reach out with additional items regarding AQ funding, and policy issues. Ted Smalley noted the need to meet again and further discuss the platform. There is additionally a need to create a process to better communicate with the railroads. Stacie Guzman noted two Merced projects complicated by railroad design review. The need for support for passenger transit into the national parks was also noted.

Washington D.C.

David Gellman noted federal actions to avoid a rail strike. Regarding appropriations, an omnibus spending bill will likely be passed before the end of the year. He noted the valley proposed earmarks as part of the omnibus agreement, and the need to include them. DOT announced a full RAISE funding announcement by December 14, 2022. The rural awards from the infrastructure grant program and mega grant program are expected to be announced by the end of the year. A Valley support letter for the earmarks will be circulated.

5. SJV REAP Program

R. Phipps/M. Sigala Michael Sigala noted an uptick in technical assistance requests, mostly related to the ADU template program. There is a workshop next week on Recent California Housing Laws. HDR's GIS Urban Footprint scenario development is in process and nearing completion. The condo construction, inclusionary housing, water supply/SMGA analysis, housing element data sets, and other ongoing Valleywide activities were noted. Robert Phipps reported on the third funding application from HCD, Fresno COG has received the amended master agreement for the remaining \$8.7 million. Michael Sigala noted the \$30k REAP valleywide request to HCD to support the 2023 Policy Conference.

6. Caltrans Directors' Report

Dennis Agar, District 10, noted an upcoming Clean California call for projects in the amount of \$100 million. Broadband funding notices are pending. The Move Over highway safety campaign is underway. A 24 Month Lookahead is up and running online to provide updates on current projects. Diana Gomez, District 6, noted a new Clean California manager. She noted a Caltrans employee fatality on Highway 41. Sustainable Transportation Grants will be due in March 2023. The Reconnecting Communities Highways to Boulevards program will allocate \$149 million for multimodal corridors. The TCEP application for the Tulare six lane project was submitted. The release of the SR 99 Multimodal Corridor Plan RFP is pending.

7. California High Speed Rail

Toni Tinoco reported a November board meeting where updates were provided. More than 400 miles of environmental review has been completed. Two design contracts are in place in Merced and Bakersfield. Two structures in Fresno and Kings counties will be opened next week. There is a new construction update video online. A Crissy grant application for a Shafter grade separation project will be submitted this week.

8. San Joaquin JPA for Passenger Rail

Dan Leavitt reported good ridership numbers over the thanksgiving holiday. He thanked the group for their support of the TCEP \$40 million Ceres-Turlock double tracking application. A Crissy job training grant application will go out today.

Additional Valleywide work efforts include:

- > ADU Template Program (Precision Engineering); status complete, ongoing TA.
- Guide to Recent California Housing Laws and Policies Affecting Local Land-Use Planning (AECOM); status – complete.
- Housing Capacity and Urban Footprint Scenario Development (HDR); status pending, almost complete.
- AFFH Technical Assistance (Mintier Harnish with Rincon Consultants, Raimi with VTA, and Estolano); status contracts complete, TA available.
- > Condo Construction Analysis (EPS); status work in process.
- > Inclusionary Housing Analysis (EPS); status work in process.
- Water Supply/SGMA Analysis (Mintier Harnish with Rincon Consultants); statuswork in process.
- The *Comprehensive Housing Report* is completed and a web landing page for online resources from the housing report, like jurisdictional data sets, has been established.
- The final and third REAP funding application has been approved by HCD. An amended master funding agreement has been received by Fresno COG and Fresno COG has submitted a 100 percent invoice to HCD for all remaining REAP 1 funding.
- Valley MPOs continue to work on the sixth cycle RHNA (regional housing needs allocations) planning. Allocations to jurisdictions have occurred in all 8 counties. The December REAP TAC meeting was held on December 13th. The next TAC meeting is on January 10th.
