DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS:

2. RTP/Sustainable Communities Strategies/Air Quality

R. Niblock

Ryan Niblock reported that the RTP/SCS data tables have been submitted to CARB. Regarding the PM2.5 SIP withdrawal, Valley COGs have been coordinating with the Air District and timing on project delivery is not problematic at this time. Ryan requested info on any RTP amendments as this might impact project delivery.

3. Budget, Policy and Legislative Updates State of California

G. Khouri

Gus Khouri noted a 75 percent democratic control of both houses. The Governor's budget was released on January 10th. He noted that the deficit previously reported shouldn't be an issue at this time due to the rainy-day fund. For transportation, he noted \$4B for transit capital (STA) was reduced to \$2B. Active transportation received general funds last year, this year the highway account will back fill active transportation. The indirect cost rate cap is now expired and the self-help counties coalition is working on this. Valley Voice Sacramento is March 29th, in-person. Gus noted \$951 million in the rainy-day fund that is slated for infrastructure investments that we should look into. A letter of support for Valley Link and the SJJPA for TIRCP funding was discussed.

Washington D.C. J. Covino

Jen Covino noted the new congress and Speaker McCarthy's new staff. In terms of the Omnibus Budget Act for 2023, it included \$15.3B for over 7,000 earmark requests which included \$42.4M for valley projects. The newly approved House Rules does not limit the ability to maintain earmarks, however the process appears to be more difficult moving forward. She noted the NOFA funding calendar is out. The Madera rural surface transportation grant was noted, and other grant award announcements are pending.

4. Regional Policy Council Meeting, January 27, 2023

M. Sigala

Michael Sigala reviewed agenda items for the upcoming Policy Council meeting. A short discussion ensued; membership was discussed.

5. SJV REAP Program

R. Phipps/M. Sigala

Michael Sigala noted an uptick in technical assistance requests mostly related to ADU assistance. He noted other valleywide activities including new assignments for condo construction, SGMA and inclusionary housing (Ripon, McFarland, Clovis, Visalia and Stockton are proposed case studies). Robert Phipps noted that Fresno COG has submitted the final REAP invoice for \$8.75M to HCD. A short discussion ensued about AFFH technical assistance. A late February 2023 REAP committee is being planned; membership was discussed.

6. SJV 2023 Policy Conference (April 24-26)

Diane Nguyen provided a quick update. A workshop meeting for next week was mentioned. Blueprint Awards were noted.

D. Gomez/D. Agar

Dennis Agar, District 10, noted road closures due to the recent rain and snow storms. He noted a March 25th Clean California day throughout California. Michael Navarro, District 6 Assistant Director, noted road closures, Planning Grant applications are due March 9th, and pending RAISE grant applications were noted.

8. California High Speed Rail

T. Tinoco

Toni Tinoco reported the opening of a number of structures, Fowler/Adams, Kings County. A RFQ for station delivery support was released. HSR was at the TRB conference this past week.

9. San Joaquin JPA for Passenger Rail

D. Leavitt

Dan Leavitt reported increased ridership during the holidays; about 80 percent compared to pre-COVID. The business plan update will be presented at the upcoming board meeting. A TIRCP and RAISE application are pending. The Tulare, Kings and Fresno COG planning grant for the Kings-Tulare HSR station planning and Cross Valley was noted.

10. California Inland Port Study

S. Jhutti

Tony Boren noted the pending CalSTA grant application. The project is now renamed Trade Port California.

11. San Joaquin Valley Household Travel Survey

K. Cai

Kristine Cai noted the survey is well underway with recent outreach efforts focusing on transit riders. The survey is scheduled to be completed by the end of June 2023.

REAP Update February 2, 2023

- **Technical Assistance** to Valley jurisdictions is available utilizing the following consultants:
 - ➢ AECOM
 - Mintier Harnish
 - Precision Engineering
 - QK (Quad Knopf)

11 jurisdictions have requested technical assistance to date: *Arvin, McFarland, Atwater, Kingsburg, Bakersfield, Clovis, Stanislaus County, Hughson, Stockton, Madera County, and Lodi.*

- Additional Valleywide work efforts include:
 - > ADU Template Program (Precision Engineering); status complete, ongoing TA.
 - ➤ Guide to Recent California Housing Laws and Policies Affecting Local Land-Use Planning (AECOM); status complete.
 - Housing Capacity and Urban Footprint Scenario Development (HDR); status pending, almost complete.
 - AFFH Technical Assistance (Mintier Harnish with Rincon Consultants, Raimi with VTA, and Estolano); status contracts complete, TA available.
 - Condo Construction Analysis (EPS); status work in process.
 - Inclusionary Housing Analysis (EPS); status work in process.
 - ➤ Water Supply/SGMA Analysis (Mintier Harnish with Rincon Consultants); statuswork in process.
- The *Comprehensive Housing Report* is completed and a web landing page for online resources from the housing report, like jurisdictional data sets, has been established.
- The final and third REAP funding application has been approved by HCD. An amended master funding agreement has been received by Fresno COG and Fresno COG has submitted a 100 percent invoice to HCD for all remaining REAP 1 funding.
- Valley MPOs continue to work on the sixth cycle RHNA (regional housing needs allocations) planning. Allocations to jurisdictions have occurred in all 8 counties. The January REAP TAC meeting was held on January 10th. The next TAC meeting is on February 14th.
- REAP workshop series:

A workshop on *GIS Housing Capacity and Analysis Tools for the SJV* is scheduled for February 28, 2022 at 1pm.
