DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS:

2. RTP/Sustainable Communities Strategies/Air Quality

R. Niblock

Ryan Niblock noted SJ COG has a tentatively approved SCS. Work is ongoing with FHWA, EPA and Caltrans for highway sanction item. Mr. Niblock noted he is sharing a memo template for staff to complete to identify projects in the Valley and other information. There are currently \$1.3 billion in projects identified as at risk. Additional at-risk projects further down the pipeline amount to \$3.4 billion. The Air District is working hard to get the contingency measures approved for the SIP in question, this would help significantly. Another meeting for next week with FHWA, EPA and Caltrans is pending. Ahron Hakimi noted Speaker McCarthy's office is aware of the issue; Mr. Hakimi requested a draft memo from Ryan summarizing this item. Tom Jordan and Ryan would work on finalizing the draft memo and share it with the Directors. Tom Jordan added that EPA did send out a notice saying they are ready to release the proposed SIP.

3. Budget, Policy, and Legislative Updates State of California

G. Khouri

Gus Khouri reported the legislature is on summer recess. SB 125 (transportation trailer bill) the indirect cost rate proposal cap, charge that Caltrans passes over to self-help-counties for work on the state highway system, was noted. The 10 percent cap is now permanent. Mr. Kouri noted the TIRCP program funding for transit that is forthcoming. CalSTA is proposing to have draft guidelines available by mid-September. This will be a grant formula program with about \$560 million coming to the Valley. Eligible expenses will be in line with current TIRCP guidelines with a focus on supplementing transit operations.

Madera will be hosting an upcoming CTC meeting, and an upcoming WTS meeting in Fresno was noted.

Washington D.C. J. Covino

David Gellman noted the full list of earmarks from the Valley that is in the meeting agenda packet. As of late last week, there is a list of projects selected to be included in the budget bill. In the House, all the Valley projects are identified to be funded at some level. In the Senate, there was an over subscription of funding request. Both the House and Senate earmarks are not typically included in the continuing resolution for funding if this is the outcome of the current budget process.

Mr. Gellman went on to discuss the upcoming Valley Voice trip. He is working on getting a set room for members to come to us. Simon and Company continue to update the federal platform.

4. Directors' Retreat

Ted Smalley noted a moderator (Eileen) has been hired and she will be contacting and interviewing attendees prior to the workshop. Robert Phipps has arranged a first night activity, axe throwing in Oakhurst.

5. SJV REAP Program

M. Sigala & R. Phipps

Michael Sigala reviewed current valleywide work efforts. An inclusionary housing webinar is slated for August 22nd. Self Help Enterprises is interested in the REAP ADU program; they have a financing program for ADUs. Ahron Hakimi noted a couple subdivisions in Bakersfield that have an ADU on each lot. Robert Phipps noted we are still waiting for the \$4.35 million from HCD for the last REAP installment.

6. Caltrans Directors' Report

D. Gomez/D. Agar

Diana Gomez, District 6, noted State transportation Secretary and Director visits next week in Fresno. Tomorrow is the kickoff meeting for the SR 99 Comprehensive Multimodal Corridor Plan. US DOT MEGA grant application for Madera HSR is in the planning stages to be resubmitted. The INFRA Kern 58/99 grant application is under review. Highways to Blvds. grant program deadline for submittal is September 20th. Dennis Agar, District 10, noted a MEGA application will be filled again for the I-5 Stockton Viaduct project. A climate action program manager position is out for recruitment.

7. California High Speed Rail

8. San Joaquin JPA for Passenger Rail

Rene Gutierrez provided an update. He noted a final study published for the Southern Alameda County rail study. The Merced intermodal track connection project is under development. The ACE Ceres-Turlock expansion is preparing for another grant application to INFRA. A kick-off meeting is pending for the Madera HSR EIR. The next SJJPA board meeting is September 22nd.

Terri King noted funding announcements have been made for inland ports. Tony Boren noted a debriefing meeting with the State on August 14th to further discuss.
