DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS:

2. RTP/Sustainable Communities Strategies/Air Quality

Diane Nguyen provided the report: Regarding Highway Sanctions: our legislative advocates are indicating that the sanctions issue will be cleared before December 27, 2023. Thankfully, the 45-day stopgap funding bill has kept EPA in business to keep working on our issue. In the meantime, Caltrans/FHWA/EPA staff are continuing to do the work of reviewing our project lists and preapproving exempt projects should sanctions actually occur. Regarding RTP/SCS: we still have a few SCS's under review in the Valley. For those of us who have received a "verbal approval" of our SCS from CARB staff – we're still waiting for a timeline for an official approval. Two things need to happen - CARB staff needs to finish their own reports on our SCS, and we need a signed letter from CARB leadership. I'll push for a timeline from CARB by the next Directors Meeting. Post RTP/SCS Review & Modeling: Coming out of the Directors Retreat, there is a desire to reconvene the Valley Modelers Group. We'll plan to meet in November to compare notes on how our models performed in the last RTP, and on the notes received from CARB on what they expect out of our models in the future. We'll brainstorm ideas to make Valleywide improvements, and report back to the Directors.

3. Budget, Policy, and Legislative Updates State of California

Gus Khouri noted the September 14th close of the legislative session. There is a \$31.5 billion deficit. The governor did sign AB 557 (brown act) which removes the January 1, 2024, sunset date for AB 361, but it necessitates a declaration of state of emergency. SB 746 was sponsored by Valleylink for a hydrogen facility in the City of Tracy. SB 125 funds (TIRCP transit), MPOs are currently assessing how to utilize these funds. CalSTA TIRCP cycle seven is being delayed by 60 days. Depending on the tax filings due in October, this might impact the amount of infrastructure funding available in the state. Ted Smalley noted the need to more strategically discuss the state platform for 2024. Tom Jordan reported that AB 985 (Arambula) was amended in the senate and went back to the assembly. It failed in the assembly but is still on the floor.

Washington D.C.

Jen Covino noted the 45-day continuing resolution to keep the federal government funded through November 17th. Speaker McCarthy lost his speakership role last week. Scalese has been nominated as speaker. Jim Jordan is also a contender. Jen Covino noted Ms. Butler as the new California senator. Jen noted a Valley Voice meeting summary that was sent via email prior to this meeting. FHWA has announced their FY 2024 formula allocations for the bridge program. DOT has announced Crissy grant selections. FHWA has an electric vehicle infrastructure NOFA out. DOT has a Thriving Communities NOFA out. EPA has a Clean School Bus NOFA out. The EPA highway sanction item was noted. Tom Jordan reported he would coordinate with Jen about following up with EPA prior to the December 17th deadline.

4. SJV REAP Program

M. Sigala & R. Phipps Michael Sigala reviewed current valleywide work efforts. There are 19 technical assistance assignments; most of the TA requests are for ADU assistance. Michael reviewed the various other work efforts underway and pending webinars. Robert Phipps noted the revised funding MOU was for the third round of REAP I funding. Six of the eight counties (MPOs) have submitted invoices for final payment. Robert noted the Urban Footprint RHNA Insights Tool as ongoing with 11 organizations participating. In terms of REAP 1 closeout, its looking like the end of July or August 2024 will be the close out months for activity. Ted Smalley requested information on existing balances and the need to reallocate funds if needed, with a priority on maintaining funds in the Valley (versus returning funds to Sacramento). Mr. Smalley requested to further discuss funding balances at the December meeting.

5. Caltrans Directors' Report

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

Diana Gomez, District 6, noted the SR 99 Comprehensive Multimodal Corridor Plan kickoff meeting and a stakeholder meeting. The next workshop will occur on October 20th. FY 23-24 Caltrans Sustainable Planning Grant awards were recently announced. On October 26th there will be a workshop for the planning grants. DOT MEGA application for the Madera HSR station was submitted. DOT INFRA, Caltrans worked with Kern COG on the SR 99/58 connector and worked with Fresno COG on the South Fresno Interchanges. Clean California, cycle two, District 6 received 29 applications and awarded six. Dennis Agar, District 10, noted Clean California, cycle two, District 10 received 10 applications and awarded three. FY 23-24 Caltrans Sustainable Planning Grant, District 10 will hold a workshop next week. Mr. Agar announced that Marlon Regisford was named the District 7 Deputy Director of Planning.

6. California High Speed Rail

Toni Tinoco noted a \$202 million Crissy grant award for work in the City of Shafter. Construction package 4 (Wasco) civil work and project completion is anticipated in the coming months.

7. San Joaquin JPA for Passenger Rail

Michael Hanebutt noted a Sacramento event on October 4th for the next completion of their Central City Implementation project. The next Rail Commission meeting is on November 3rd. The next SJ JPA board meeting is on November 17th. TIRCP applications are due in March 2024, and they are working on those applications now.

8. TradePort California

Tony Boren noted a forthcoming federal grant in the amount \$1.75 million.

9. San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District

Tom Jordan noted a CARB action on October 26th on a smog check measure. This is the last piece/roadblock for the EPA contingency measure item.

10. MioCar EV Car Sharing

Michael Sigala noted high usage in Stockton. They are submitting a \$500k grant application to CARB for technical assistance and capacity building.

11. California Partnership for the San Joaquin Valley

No report provided. Michael Sigala noted he spoke with Jim Suennen, associate secretary for external affairs at the California Health and Human Services Agency for an update on the nomination process. Eduardo Gonzales is out on a leave of absence for an unknown period of time. The executive committee is scheduled to meet again to discuss the status of current members, vacancies and new appointments. Ted Smalley requested a letter with his signature formally requesting that Terri King become the new representative for the COG Directors. The next Partnership Board meeting is December 8th in Modesto.
