Introduction

The San Joaquin Valley Blueprint Awards program aims to promote quality planning and development by recognizing outstanding achievements and practices in the built environment. By highlighting projects that embody the Blueprint Principles, we hope to showcase visually appealing, functional, and environmentally friendly initiatives that can serve as models for similar efforts throughout the Valley.

Awards will be presented at the 18th Annual San Joaquin Valley Regional Policy Conference on Friday, April 11, 2025, at the Merced Theatre at 301 W. Main Street.

Blueprint Principles

On April 1, 2009, the San Joaquin Valley Regional Policy Council adopted a list of Smart Growth Principles, known as the "Blueprint Principles," to guide Blueprint planning in the San Joaquin Valley, including:

- 1. Create a range of housing opportunities and choices
- 2. Create walkable and bikeable neighborhoods
- 3. Encourage community and stakeholder collaboration
- 4. Foster distinctive, attractive communities with a strong sense of place
- 5. Make development decisions predictable, fair, and cost-effective
- 6. Promote a mix of land uses
- 7. Preserve open space, farmland, natural beauty, and critical environmental areas
- 8. Provide a variety of transportation choices
- 9. Strengthen and direct development toward existing communities
- 10. Take advantage of compact building design
- 11. Enhance the economic vitality of the region
- 12. Support actions that encourage environmental resource management
- 13. Plan for future water needs

These principles remain applicable today and align with current climate, social, environmental, transportation, and housing goals at the state and federal levels.

Award Categories

Only one first-place award, the "Award of Excellence," will be given in each category. In addition, one outstanding finalist in each category may receive an "Award of Merit." If the judges determine that none of the nominations in a category meet the criteria, no award will be given in that category.

- A. Residential Development Project Category
- **B.** Commercial Development Project Category
- C. Mixed-Use Development Project Category
- D. Downtown Revitalization Project Category
- E. Transportation Enhancement Project Category
- F. Historic Revitalization Project Category

The above Development Project Categories must include documentation of existing projects completed from January 2020 to December 2024.

G. Planning Project/Program Category

Recognition of outstanding planning projects or programs that promote and facilitate Blueprint-friendly initiatives. Eligible projects or programs must have been developed within the last four years (between January 2021 and December 2024). Examples may include specific plans, transportation plans, downtown revitalization efforts, corridor plans, or on-the-ground environmental and sustainable programs.

H. Darrel Hildebrand Blueprint Leadership Award Category

This award honors the memory of the former Blueprint project manager from Kern COG, who was deeply involved in the planning process. The results of his efforts continue to support our transition from the planning phase to the implementation phase of the Blueprint. Darrel is remembered for his meticulous attention to detail and commitment to ensuring that the planning principles remained the focal point of the San Joaquin Valley Blueprint Planning Process.

I. Jenny Kenoyer Outstanding Local Elected Official Category

This award is named in honor of Jenny Kenoyer, a former Modesto City Councilmember and Regional Policy Council member, who was the first recipient of the award in 2022. Jenny demonstrated exceptional leadership and dedication to local and regional issues. The award will be presented to a local elected official (from the city or county) who has displayed outstanding leadership and advocacy for promoting local and regional initiatives aligning with the Blueprint Principles.

Eligibility Requirements

All applicants must meet the following criteria:

 Nominations are now open for candidate projects and individuals from the eight counties of the San Joaquin Valley: Kern, Kings, Tulare, Fresno, Madera, Merced, Stanislaus, and San Joaquin. Development projects must be completed or fully built/constructed within the last five years or between January 2020 and December 2024. Projects completed before January 2020 will not be considered.

 Planning projects/programs or individuals should align with the Blueprint Principles, and nominators must provide strong justification for the nomination.

• The planning project or program must have been adopted or implemented by its jurisdiction within the last four years or between January 2021 and December 2024.

• The project or individual cannot be a previous recipient of the Blueprint Award (please refer to the list of past recipients on pages 6-8).

• Eligible applicants include jurisdictions, governmental agencies, nonprofit organizations, collaborative efforts, and private entities.

Nomination Submittal Requirements

1. Nomination Form: Completed Blueprint Awards Nomination Form.

2. Summary Description: One-page summary of the nominated award candidate.

3. Award Criteria: One to two-page explanation of how the candidate specifically reflects at least two Blueprint Principles listed in the packet.

4. Letter(s) of Support: At least one, but no more than three, one-page letter(s) of support for the nominated project/candidate.

5. Images: 3 to 5 high-quality digital images in JPG format. Include a brief description for each image.

Please note:

 All submissions must strictly follow the material requirements outlined below and on the Blueprint Awards Nomination Form.

• Each applicant (agency or nominator) may only submit one project or nomination per award category (reference Categories A through I listed on Page 3).

Do not submit paper copies.

Incomplete submissions or late submittals will not be accepted.
